CAPEX Updates

- Construction continues on the new Standpipe project. 11th ring has been installed and second section of 5 out of the 6 pilasters have been installed.
- Construction has started on 75-22-LFC NCWP4 safety improvements.
 Miron and ESCO have Mobilized on site.
- Work continues on the Newton Road roundabout – the utility work on this project is being executed under a Coordination Project Agreement with the UI. IronX Construction is the contractor. Lower sidewalks have been opened south of Newton Drive Started work on water lines by ramp 1.
- Oakdale Power Plant Salt room roof Punchlist issued.
- Oakdale Power Plant Add UPS working on punch list.
- Oakdale Tower Pump Improvement Pump skid fabrication underway and electrical gear installation is starting this week.
- Water Plant Ferric + Fluoride improvement - 5X Ferric pumps have been installed and commissioned, remaining ones are scheduled for next week. Fluoride system plumbing near complete.



- HSAB Sanitary sewer repairs are complete, and roadway is poured back and road opened back up. Electrical gear has all been set in place. Steam and chilled water interface work is ongoing.
- Water Plant Roof Substantial completion
- Hydraulic Lab Steam punch list complete, working on close out
- Gymnastics/Sprit Squad working on punch list items
- Biology/Van Allen tunnel work Contract was awarded, and submittal process is underway.

O&M Updates

Distribution

- Mechanical Distribution received delivery of a new Ditch Witch Vacuum Excavator.
- Mechanical Distribution started potholing for utilities in support of Cap Ex project Hawkins Dr G9 Steam.
- Mechanical Distribution assisted Electrical Distribution with loading and transporting of electrical gear to the HSAB site, while the Electrical Distribution team is focused on the EPGF project completion.
- Electrical Distribution continues the 15kV cable pulling and splicing in the UIHC complex to support the UIHC Emergency Power Generating Facility (EPGF) expansion project.
- Electrical Distribution welcomed our new Electrician Gary Bias.
- Meters & Controls is working to backfill E&I Tech positions from recent openings.

Water Treatment Services

- Congratulations to Benjamin Stumpf for achieving his Grade #2 DNR Water Distribution Certification.
- This month the maintenance staff completed an evaluation and performed preventive maintenance on the South Sed Basin.
- RO membrane replacement is planned to be completed at the water plant on RO #1 train soon.

Power Plant

- EVT testing took place on the Boilers at Oakdale. One of the safety relief valves on Boiler 3 was identified as having a small amount of leak-by. A replacement plan is being developed.
- TG6 was taken offline for a brief outage to address an oil leak.
- A leak was identified in Boiler 11 in late
 January. Initial indications were made due
 to water quality findings by the Ops team.
 The unit was shut down to allow for cleanout
 and repairs to take place. This work will
 carry over into the first week of February.
 Great work by all involved in the
 identification before it became worse as well
 as the work to correct the issues in a safe
 and diligent way.

Chilled Water

- Congratulations to Shane Farr, Gary
 McClure III & Joel Sargent recently passed
 RSES exam Condensers, Compressors and
 Cooling Towers. They will be moving on to
 the next step in the RSES educational
 training process, studying Evaporators and
 System components section with the RSES
 training format.
- OM-8 overhaul Engie & JCI working through long lead time items on turbine and compressor shaft setbacks.
- YK-3 overhaul is on schedule with the exception off overhauling the drive motor, lead time on rebuild 12 weeks.
- Condenser water pump overhaul at CWP-3 scheduled for completion in February.



Steve DellaBetta, Shaun Greene, and Justin Lorenzen visited the Johnson Controls chiller production facility located outside of San Antonio on January 14th to witness the factory acceptance test of the chiller being purchased for the Oakdale Chilled Water Plant. The chiller was operated at four different stages of operation to confirm that it meets the specified performance requirements it was designed for. The chiller passed at all four stages. It is scheduled to arrive on campus late January 2025.
